# a. Melissa Head of School Report

Enrollment updates for current enrollment was shared for all three schools. Reregistration and new enrollment for next year begins February 28, 2022

Student Enrollment: CVA 950, ISORPH 273, and ORDCA 115. At the time the report was pulled total student count was 1338.

We are actively searching for 2-3 new ISORPH Board members that would be a good fit for our schools. Please send interested candidates to <a href="mailto:mhausmann@k12.com">mhausmann@k12.com</a>.

Chet said that we should reach out to Mitchell SD to see if they may have any interest out there.

Melissa and staff are actively looking as well. Melissa has reached out to the Oregon Parent Coalition group that advocate for virtual schools. There might be one potential candidate.

Chet shared that PPS have lost 3,000 students last year and again this year. We should target the Portland area.

Highlights for Elementary School – K-8 – Chelsea Gill

- We have implemented a phonics-based intervention curriculum K-5 to support students in this area.
- We have also put in a monthly progress monitoring system in place to support students who are behind in courses.
- Disney and Lego clubs for K-5 students are being taught by two of our teachers.
- Working with MTSS Coordinator for engagement and outreach opportunities for students and families.

### Highlights for Middle School – Chelsea Gill

- We have added electives form Sem 2, this is the first time offering this to Middle School students.
- In Sem 2 we added Math and ELA small groups to help students who need this support and are one to two grade levels behind.
- Our Homeroom are supporting two session a week that focus on the 7 Mindsets and building relationships.
- 6<sup>th</sup> grade team is additionally holding a lunch bunch 1x a week to support these students who have transitioned from Elementary to Middle school.
- We are rolling out monthly course progress monitoring beginning in March. This is the same process we have been using at the Elementary level.

# Highlights for High School - Carrie Quinn

- Carrie reported on passing rates for Sem 1 are 77%, quarter passing rates are 75%. This is a huge increase in passing rates for our students. Teachers are balancing both Semester and Quarter courses.
- DOK and Engagement for all students Professional Development
- We are adding a 5<sup>th</sup> pathway for our CTE courses for Machinery Manufacturing. We are also adding dual credit courses for our students. Algebra and Adobe Photoshop. For CVA and Insight Students, they will be able to take advantage of these opportunities.
- We are also partnering with OIT to have a full freshmen complete for their senior year. The goal is to have this in place for next school year.
- We are aligning our high school students with the Mitchell SD schedule for 2022-2023 school year offering core classes Monday through Thursday and focusing on intervention on Fridays.
- We have a new Art teacher that is very enthusiastic, she will be travelling to New

York to attend the National Art Education Convention. It is great to have Art represented as an offering for our students.

Skip shared how excited he was about the Art focus in our schools, specifically with a business focus.

Chet wanted to know if we need Middle School elective ideas. He shared about a program in the Portland area where Middle School students can earn credit for chess for success.

Chelsea shared we want to balance interesting electives for our students but stay very focused on core class success.

Today is the second reading for all 28 Board Policy Updates presented last month and previously sent to the Board for review. This will be an action item for today.

# Overview and Key Assumptions

Enrollment is lower by 797 students as compared to Budget (-37%).

Revenue is (\$6.76M) (-35%) lower vs, Budget

Expenses decreased by (\$7.7M (-34%), primarily due to reduction in CFA positions and alignment to ratio, as a result Deficit is improved by \$962K.

Decrease of enrollment by school:

Total -797 ISOR-PH -511 ORCVA -119 ORDCA -167

### FY22 Budget vs. 7 + 5 Forecast

Revenue decreased by (\$6.76M) due to lower enrollment of -797 students resulting in 1,402 total overall student enrollment. Due to lower costs for salary, benefits, curriculum, materials, computer, testing and related services expenses. Increased costs for higher liability insurance and increased cloud storage. Overall Deficit improved by (\$962K). K12 issued (\$962K) to balance the budget.

#### FY22 Prior Forecast v. 7 + 5

Revenue decreased due to lower enrollment. Melissa did a really good job of decreasing expenses beyond the revenue change. She has been able to push hiring into the upcoming school year. This has offset some of the unexpected expenses that have occurred this year. This improves the deficit by (\$312K).

#### **FY Restricted Funds**

Measure 98 Grant (High School Graduation and College and Career Readiness)

FY Grant allocation \$416,308.

Total available with carryover is \$490,189

Total FY spending to date \$256,675

Balance \$233,514

#### ESSA (Every Student Succeeds Act)

FY Grant allocation \$43,038

Total available with carryover is \$172,308

Total FY spending to date \$77,644

Balance \$94,664

Melissa explained the ESSA Partnership with Mitchell. This Grant focused on improving

student chronic absenteeism. Mitchell has passed along 100% of this grant to us. This grant will be available again next year. It will depend on attendance rates at our ISORPH school.

#### **Balance Sheet**

This reflects current assets as completed to liabilities current as compared to last school year. Expenses are up due to pre-paid expenses which are primarily K12 as related to K12 curriculum, materials, and computers for students. Other liabilities are down due to decreased

#### Cash Flow

Balance at 1/31/22 \$1,600,972

Due to K12 \$1,747,666

K12 is requesting a proposed payment to K12 for January of \$329,151.

Chet commented that we are doing a great job of making progress by keeping our student and teacher ratios in balance.

Melissa shared that next year's budget is beginning to be worked on and is due to Mitchell SD by May 1st .
