B. Head of School Report – Sonimar Villegas

SY 2020-21 Enrollment updates were shared out for all three schools. CVA - 1070 students, ORDCA – 215, ISORPH – 499 students. Currently there are 45 students in the pipeline. The portal for the SY 2021-22 opened on 2/25/21 and re-registration for current students opens on 3/4/2021. We are really excited about our next school year.

Carrie Quinn - Principal

Elementary school activities. Areas we are working on for growth. We are focused on support groups, clubs, and other opportunities to create connections with our students. We have a spelling bee group and a book club. Smaller class sizes. Our staff have grown from three to thirteen teachers at CVA.

Carrie shared out our new class structure focused on Math and ELA.

We are working on attendance and raising awareness. Connecting with students and families. We have focused on more live instruction, shared a new platform which is fun and allowing students to have a more personal connection.

We are tracking data for our students on all standards. The teachers are reviewing the data they collect at the beginning of the week to make any needed adjustments later in the week.

Our teachers are co-teaching classes. Special programs teachers and core teachers are in the same classes at the same time. This is driving better connection and activity of students on IEP's.

Battle of the books club has been a hit with the students.

Samantha Gonzalez - Assistant Principal

We have grown from 4-13 teachers since August. We have been able to decrease class sizes, dropping from 50 -60 student to around 30 and be able to differentiate in their class connect sessions.

Sem 2 live instruction schedule shared out.

Example of a Live Instruction for Advanced students. Students can come in and create. This has been rewarding to watch students' flourish in this live instruction schedule.

Collaboration of Co-Teaching and benefits are being realized between Special Programs Teachers and Core Teachers. Students have more Teachers they can connect with using their approach.

Student Data and Standards tracking is being shared out and discussed in our Wednesday meetings.

Heather Shunk - Assistant Principal

It has been a joy to join this team December 2020. "Every kid is one caring adult away from being a success story." This has been exhibited from our high school staff to our students.

Creative writing club, book club, and gaming clubs have been launched to bring students together, feel connected, and build life skills.

Live Instruction for the High School schedule and classes were shared. Home room, what is covered and how this works to build relationship with students.

Our enduring connection call process that occurs between staff, new students and families is foundational to the success of student in our schools. This is driving connection with our students and families, showing how staff are available and gaining important specific information about the students. This is beneficial to know how to support our students.

Our Digital Photography Teacher shared out photography that students are taking and tying to real world situations.

Carrie Quinn shared about Tallo. Tallo is a Career and College platform for students like LinkdIn. They can share their interests, resumes, direction for where they want to go in their future and can connect with other people in their field of interest. It can also expose students to scholarship opportunities.

Skip shared out his kudos for the Administration team and everything that they are doing to build relationships with students. Staff is doing a great job that will go a long way to achieving school results.

Chet appreciated the Academic Team for all that they shared on what is happening on the academic front.

Sonimar shared information on the accreditation process. Appreciated Chet and Skip for their interview time with the accreditation team.
